TECHNICAL REGULATIONS;

5.1 INTRODUCTION

The following technical regulations are set out in accordance with Motorsport UK. specified format and it should be clearly understood that if the following texts do not clearly specify that you can do it, you should work on the principal that you cannot.

Where nothing is listed for a reference number and heading, the subject is 'free' within Motorsport UK Regulations.

5.2 GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The Series is for competitors competing in the Roadsports Class, comprising enclosed wheeled cars of unitary or spaceframe construction capable of carrying a driver and one passenger. There shall be three classes;

Cl.A; for front-engined road sports and kit cars with normally aspirated four cylinder arderived engines up to 2200cc running on road tyres.

Cl B; for cars with motor-cycle-derived engines of less than 930cc, or Ford Zetec-powered cars of less that 1800ccs capacity running in standard form (See Appendix 2) running on road tyres.

Cl C; for mid or rear-engined sports, kit and Clubmans chassised cars with normally aspirated motor cycle-derived engines not exceeding 1350cc and normally aspirates four cylinder car-derived engines up to 2200cc running on road tyres.

5.3 SAFETY

All Motorsport UK. Section K safety criteria regulations apply as relevant. Particularly competitors should note; (the following are minimum requirements)
