

2025 NORTHERN IRELAND FORMULA FORD 1600 CHAMPIONSHIP

Sporting Regulations-General

1.1 Title & Jurisdiction:

The Northern Ireland Formula Ford 1600 Championship is organised and administered by the 500 MRCI Ltd. in accordance with the National Competition Rules of Motorsport UK (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA) and these Championship Regulations.

1.2.3 Championship Stewards; J.D.Grieve, R.Kelly, I.Culbert

NCR 4.1.1.2 Championship Stewards may only adjudicate on any disputes, irregularities or appeals arising from the published Championship regulations. Championship Stewards are also empowered to consider any request from the Championship co-ordinator to penalize any competitor for any breach of Championship regulations after holding a formal hearing to impose a penalty in accordance with NCR Chapter 2

(W) 2.2.1 The Championship Stewards can only adjudicate on any disputes, irregularities or appeals arising from the approved Championship regulations. They are also empowered to consider any request from the Championship Co-ordinator to penalize any Competitor for breach of Championship regulations and, after holding a formal hearing, those stewards may impose a penalty in accordance with NCR Chapter 2, C.2.1.1 subject to the rights of Appeal to the National Court there provided..

1.3 Competitor Eligibility:

1.3.1 Entrants must be fully paid up valid membership card holding members of the 500 MRCI, or the SMRC, or any club affiliated to the ANICC and be in possession of valid Motorsport UK Entrants Licences.

1.3.2 Drivers and Entrant Drivers must

(a) be fully paid up valid membership card holding members of the 500 MRCI, the SMRC, or any club affiliated to the ANICC,

(b) be registered for the Championship and

(c) be in possession of a valid Race Club or above licence or.

(d) be in possession of the highest grade of national Race licence or valid FIA

International Licence, together with their ASN's written consent NCR 6.3.1.6. and FIA ISC Article 2., 3.7.b apply).

(e) If participation in the Championship requires absence from education, a driver in full time school education is required to have the approval of their head teacher and a letter stating such approval from their school in order to fulfil their registration for the Championship. A driver shall not take time out of their education to participate in motor sport without written approval of their education establishment.

1.3.3 All necessary documentation must be presented for checking at all rounds when signing-on.

1.3.4 Competitors must ensure that their cars comply with the conditions of eligibility and safety throughout qualifying and racing.

1.4 Registration:

1.4.1 Registration is automatic upon receipt of fully completed race entry

1.5 Championship Rounds: Fourteen rounds as follows: March 29 (2), April 26 (2), May 31, (2), June 28 (2), July 26 (2), August 30 (2) September 27 (2) to be held at Kirkistown and organised by the 500 MRCI.

1.6 Scoring:

1.6.1 Points will be awarded to Competitors listed as classified finishers in the Final Results as per Motorsport UK NCRs, except only that one point shall be awarded for fastest lap, with one point being awarded to the competitor setting Pole position.

1.6.2 The totals from all qualifying rounds will determine final championship points and positions.

1.6.3 Ties shall be resolved using the formula in NCR 4.3.4

1.6. Where the race distance has been reduced (2.6) it shall still count as a full points scoring round.

1.7 Awards:

1.7.1 Championship awards are to be provided by the 500 MRCI Ltd.

1.7.2 Per Round; Trophies for 1st., 2nd., and 3rd.

1.7.3 Championship; Trophies for 1st., 2nd., and 3rd.

1.7.4 Entertainment Tax Liability. In accordance with government legislation, the 500 MRCI Ltd. is legally bound to withhold tax at the basic rate on all payments to non-U.K. resident sportsmen/women and account to HMRC using form FEU 1, the quarterly return of payments made to non-resident entertainers and sportsmen/women. That is, those persons who do not have a normal permanent residence in the U.K. The U.K. does not include the Isle of Man, the Channel Islands or Eire.

This means that, as the organiser, the 500 MRCI Ltd. is required to deduct tax at the current rate from any such payments they may make to non-U.K. residents.

Under certain circumstances, it may be possible for competitors to enter into an agreement with the Inland Revenue to limit the tax withheld. Any application for such an arrangement must be made in writing and not later than 30 days before payment is due. 1.7.6 Title to all trophies; In the event of any provisional results of championship tables being revised after any provisional presentations and such revisions affect the distribution of any awards, the Competitors concerned must return such awards to the 500 MRCI Ltd. in good condition within 7 days.

2. CHAMPIONSHIP EVENT MEETINGS & RACE PROCEDURES

2.1 Entries: In accordance with Motorsport UK NCR Ch3.App5.

2.1.1 Competitors are responsible for sending in correct and complete entries with the correct entry fees prior to the entry closure dates which shall be 14 days before each round except where otherwise stated.

2.1.2 Incorrect or incomplete entries (Including driver to be nominated entries) are to be held in abeyance until they are complete and correct and the date of receipt for acceptance of entry purposes shall be the date on which the secretary of the Meeting receives the missing information or fee.

2.1.3 Any withdrawal of Entry or Driver/Car changes made after acceptance of any entry must be notified to the Secretary of the Meeting in writing. NCR 3.11.1.11 applies.

2.1.4 The Maximum entry fee for each round shall be specified in the SRs and on the Entry Form.

2.1.5 Reserves are to be nominated on the Final List of Entries published with Final Instructions or Amendment Sheet Bulletins.

2.2 Briefings:

Organisers should notify Competitors of the times and locations for all briefings in the Final Instructions for the meetings. Competitors must attend all briefings.

2.3 Qualification Practice:

2.3.1 Should any Practice Session be disrupted, the Clerk of the Course shall not be obliged to resume or re-run the session. The decision of the Clerk of the Course shall be final.

2.3.2 Each driver shall complete a minimum of 3 laps in the car to be raced, and in the correct session, in order to qualify (NCR 12.6.3.)

Should any race distance be disrupted the Clerk of the Course shall not be obliged to resume or rerun the race (NCR 12.6.9.1) . 1.6.4. above applies.

2.5 Starts:

2.5.1 All cars will be released to form up on the grid prior to the start in formation as specified on the grid sheet.

2.5.2 the start will be via standing start unless otherwise specified in the SRs.

The minimum countdown procedures/audible warnings sequence shall be:

(I) 1 minute to the start - Start Engines/Clear Grid.

(II) 30 seconds - visible and audible warning for start of Green Flag/Pace Lap.

(III) A five second board will be used to indicate that the grid is complete.

(IV) The red lights will be switched on five seconds after the board is withdrawn.

2.5.3 Any car removed from the grid after the 1 minute stage or driven into the pits on the Green Flag lap shall be held in the pit lane and may start the race after the last car has passed the startline or pitlane exit, whichever is the later.

2.5.4 Any drivers unable to start the Green Flag lap or start are required to indicate their situation as per Motorsport UK Regulation (NCR .12.6.6.11) In addition any drivers unable to maintain grid positions on the Green Flag lap, to the extent that ALL other cars are ahead of them, may complete the Green Flag lap but MUST remain at the rear of the last row of the grid but ahead of any cars to be started with a time delay.

2.5.5 In the event on any starting lights failure, the Starter will revert to the use of the National Flag.

2.6 Session Red Flag

2.6.1 Should the need arise to stop any race or practice, RED LIGHTS will be switched on at the start line. And RED FLAGS will be displayed at the Start line and at all Marshals Signalling Points around the Circuit.

This is the signal for all drivers to cease circulating at racing speed, to slow to a safe and reasonable pace and to return to the Pit lane, during practice, and to the Starting Grid area during a race, unless otherwise directed by officials.

Cars may not enter the pits unless directed to do so. Work on cars already in the pits must cease when a race is stopped.

2.7 Pits, Paddock & Pitlane Safety

2.7.1 Pits & Paddock: Competitors must ensure that Motorsport UK, Circuit Management and Organising Club Safety Regulations are complied with at all times.

2.7.2 Pitlane: The outer lane or lanes are to be kept unobstructed to allow safe passage of cars at all times.

2.7.3 Refuelling: May only be carried out in accordance with the Motorsport UK General Regulations, and those of the Organising Club and Circuit Management.

2.8 Race Finishes:

After taking the chequered flag, drivers are required to:

- I. Progressively and safely slow down.
- II. Remain behind any competitors ahead of them
- III. Return to the Pit lane entrance/Paddock entrance as instructed.
- IV. Comply with any directions given by marshals or officials
- V. Keep their helmets on and harnesses done up while on the circuit or in the pitlane.

2.9 Results:

All practice timesheets, grids, race results are to be deemed PROVISIONAL until all vehicles are released by Scrutineers after post practice/race scrutineering and/or after completion of any Judicial or Technical Procedures. (Motorsport UK Regulation NCR 3.6.1.4))

2.10 Timing Modules

2.11 Qualification Races

Where the total number of race entries exceeds the maximum permitted number of starters, the organizers may, at their discretion, run a qualification race.

2.12 Operation of Safety Car

The Safety Car will be brought into operation and run in accordance with NCR 12.8.2.

2.13 Onboard Cameras

2.13.1 An on board camera is to be used in all rounds, mounted in a fixed position. Camera footage MUST be made available to race officials on request.

2.11.2 Car/pits communication to be by use of legible pit boards. No radio communications are permitted.

3.SPECIFIC CHAMPIONSHIP REGULATIONS

3.1 By registering for the Championship, all competitors and their associates commit to positively promote and demonstrate the Motorsport UK's Respect Code which is appended to these regulations (Appendix 1)

3.1.1 Where any reports of disrespectful conduct are judged to be well-founded the Championship organisers may issue warnings or require remedial actions and/or report the matter to the Championship Stewards who may impose appropriate penalties which can include loss of Championship points and/or race bans through to Championship expulsion and referral to Motorsport UK.

In addition to this all participants must be aware of their behavior and conduct at all times. Abusive language and harmful behavior will not be tolerated. Any such incidents must be reported to the Championship Coordinator and/or Safeguarding Officer who will also relay the report to Motorsport UK. 4. SPECIFIC CHAMPIONSHIP PENALTIES

In accordance with NCR Chapter 2 ..

For infringements deemed to be of a more serious nature the Clerk of the Course and/or Stewards of the Meeting are to invoke the provisions of Regulation NCR 2.8.2.1c.

TECHNICAL REGULATIONS;

5.1 INTRODUCTION

The following technical regulations are set out in accordance with the Motorsport UK. specified format and it should be clearly understood that if the following texts do not clearly specify that you can do it, you should work on the principal that you cannot. Competitors are advised to read the following sections of the Motorsport UK National Competition Rules

Motorsport UK NCR, Chapters 7 & 8. and relevant Formula Ford 1600 Technical Regulations for the age of the car issued by the Ford Motor Company specifically and published by BRSCC.

5.2 GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The Northern Ireland Formula Ford 1600 Championship is for competitors participating in cars complying with regulations for Club F.F.1600 as published by the Ford Motor Company, Boreham Airfield, Essex CM3 3BG, and the BRSCC and incorporating amendments made for 2009-2024

Overall: For all cars complying with current FMC FF1600 regulations, There will be four categories:

Class A: For cars built after January 1st 2004

Class B: For cars built after January 1st 1994 but before January 1st 2004

Class C: For cars built after January 1st 1983 but before December 31 1993

Class D: For cars built before December 31 1982

5.3 SAFETY

All Motorsport UK. safety criteria regulations apply as relevant. Particularly competitors should note NCR Chapters 7 & 8 and Chapter 9

The wearing of flame resistant racewear is mandatory for this championship.

5.13 TYRES; Avon ACB 10 as per current FMC Club FF1600 regulations with the additional option of Toyo Proxes 888r ,

1. Competitors are restricted to five (5) full car sets of tyres during the Championship.
2. The use of tyre heating/heat retention devices, tyre treatmernts and compounds are prohibited.
3. Competitors in Class D (Pre-1982) cars will be permitted to use Avon ACB9 tyres.

5.14 WEIGHTS; As per current yearbook and current FMC Club FF1600 regulations .

- 1 Minimum Weight of car in race ready condition to be no less than 420kg
- 2 Minimum weight of car in race ready condition with driver to be no less than 500kg

5.15 FUEL TANK/FUEL; As per Motorsport UK NCRs and current FMC Club FF1600 regulations

5.16 SILENCING; As per current Club FMC FF1600 regulations

- 1 Specification

5.17 NUMBERS & CHAMPIONSHIP DECALS

- 1 Positions; Numbers must be displayed in accordance with Motorsport UK NCRs. Championship decals must be displayed in conspicuous positions, if competitors are so instructed by the organisers.
